## The Bologna Reform, a Response to Challenges, Seen in a Regional and Global Context

### **Stefan Delplace**

Secretary General EURASHE, Brussels, Belgium

Stefan Delplace became the Secretary General of EURASHE (European Association of Institutions in Higher Education) in 2004, which he represents in the Bologna Follow up Group and several of its working and coordination groups.

He is also the representative of EURASHE in the 'E4' Group (with ENQA, EUA, ESU), which received mandates from the 'Bologna ministers' to harmonise Quality Assurance through the creation of European Standards and Guidelines for Quality Assurance, and has been a member of various Advisory and Expert groups of the European Commission and of stakeholders organisations in higher education (Cooperation with Enterprises, Innovation, the construction of the Integrated Lifelong Learning Programme, and the reform of the Jean Monnet programme).

Stefan is a graduate of the University of Ghent (Languages and Business studies), and spent some time teaching (in-service training for companies, continuous education). He has run an international office of a University College for over 15 years, before specializing in policy towards and activities with partner countries of the E.U. (Tempus-Tacis & MEDA), and more recently in the implementation of the Bologna Process.

He is presently involved, on behalf of EURASHE, in the Advisory Boards of the Independent Assessment of the Bologna process, the Global dimension initiatives of the Bologna Process, the AHELO project of OECD, and the Assessment of the Education-Enterprise dialogue run by the European Commission.

## Education for a “Better World”: International Co-operation between Nationalism and Globalism

### **Prof. Dr. Pavel Zgaga**

University of Ljubljana, Slovenia

Pavel Zgaga is Professor of Philosophy of Education and Education Policy at the University of Ljubljana, Slovenia. He is a philosopher and sociologist by training with degrees (PhD in philosophy) from the University of Ljubljana. During the period of social and political transition he was State Secretary for Higher Education (1992 – 1999) and Minister of Education (1999 – 2000). In 2001, after his return to academe, he co-founded the Centre for Educational Policy Studies (CEPS). He has held several research grants and directed a number of national and international projects on education policy and particularly on higher education topics. He has also led several national and international projects concerned with development of higher education in the contemporary European context (particularly the Bologna Process) as well as with teacher education as a specific area of higher education. In these areas, he has been co-operating with relevant agencies of the European Commission and with several international organisations, e.g. the Council of Europe, UNESCO, OECD, World Bank, etc. He has been consultant or invited speaker at conferences and at universities in a number of countries. He has also engaged in the Bologna process, serving as general rapporteur (2001-2003), as a member of the Board of the Bologna Follow-up Group (2004-2005) and as the rapporteur of the BFUG Working Group on External Dimension of the Bologna Process (2006-2007). He is a co-founder and Board member of the TEPE Network (Teacher Education Policy in Europe; 2006).

He is a member of the editorial boards for the *Journal of Educational Policy*, the *Theory and Research in Education* and the *Education Inquiry* as well as a member of the International Editorial Advisory Board for the journal *Voprosy obrazovaniya (Educational issues; Moscow)*. In 2007, he received an honorary doctorate from University of Umeå, Sweden. He is an external member of the Board of the South East European University in Tetovo, FYROM.

## Intercultural Dialogue, Learning Environment and the Media


### **Prof. Dr. Charis Xirouchakis**

Head of the Visits and Publications Unit, European Economic and Social Committee, Brussels, Belgium

After a first degree in law and economics at Athens I took a Masters (MA Econ) at the University of Manchester and a Drs (Doctorandus) at Amsterdam University, where I also worked as a lecturer. I only gave up my academic prospects for what I considered to be a major project: the negotiations for Greece's accession to the EC during which I was fully involved. When these were brought to a positive end I pursued a brief banking career with Citibank and the European Investment Bank in Rome.

My first European job was at the Council of the EU where I initially worked in the Private Office of the Secretary General. To follow negotiations amidst ministers and ambassadors and in close contact with the Commission allowed me to grasp the wide-ranging work done in Brussels for creating a pioneering model in collective governance. I subsequently undertook policy assignments in development aid, notably in sub-Saharan Africa, and in research where I had the opportunity to get closer to my old friends - the academic world. But it was my next assignment in communication that gave me a key insight: by lecturing to varied audiences in different countries I came to realise the immense vacuum separating the work performed in Brussels from people's perception of it. Between 2001 and 2007 I held visiting professor posts at the University of Tor Vergata (Roma III), the University of Riga and the School of Public Administration in Athens. As some readers may have guessed I feel something of an academic *manqué*.

Since September 2007 I am Head of Unit in the communication department at the European Economic and Social Committee (EESC). The Committee is a EU consultative body made up of representatives of the various economic and social players in civil society, known collectively as organised civil society. Its main task is to advise the EU's three major institutions: Commission, Council and Parliament. In a Union of 27 Members States (and counting) and 23 languages with all its many different cultures and players, the Union's representative democracy needs to be complemented by participatory democracy, meaning a structured dialogue with civil society.



The EESC is well placed to act as a bridge between the Union and civil society across Europe. Communicating on this dimension may contribute to improve EU's public perception. The challenge is on!
