## Euro-Mediterranean (EMUNI) Summer School

*The University Center for Euro-Mediterranean Studies (the EMUNI Center) was established in 2007 by the Government of the Republic of Slovenia.*

### Principal aims of the EMUNI Center:

- to overcome boundaries and differences, as well as build a mutual understanding among Euro-Mediterranean countries;
- to create an academic network with partner higher education and research institutions;
- to establish an international Euro-Mediterranean University.

### Main events and activities in 2008:

- solemn inauguration of the Euro-Mediterranean University, June 9;
- Rector's panel on Dialogue between cultures and Higher Education, June 9;
- first meeting of the International Academic Council, June 9;
- a Euro-Mediterranean workshop on the future EU Maritime Policy, organized by the European Commission, the EMUNI Centre, and the Ministry of Transport, June 10;
- the Euro-Mediterranean Summer School, June – August;
- the International Conference on Intercultural Dialogue and Management, organized by the European Institute of the Mediterranean, the EMUNI Center, the University of Primorska, the Faculty of Management Koper, November 26 – 29 in Barcelona;
- offering accredited programs with partner universities in the 2008 – 2009 academic year.

### Welcome

Students from all over the world are welcome to the EMUNI Summer School to:

- study Mediterranean issues;
- have a great holiday on the Slovenian Coast;
- meet new friends, exchange ideas and gain new cultural experiences.

### When?

**Term A** June 16 – 28, 2008

**Term B** June 30 – July 12, 2008

**Term C** August 18 – 30, 2008

Students will have the possibility to attend only one course in each term.

### Where?

The lectures will be held at the seat of the EMUNI Center in Portorož, Slovenia.

### Summer school Courses and ECTS

Partner universities will offer post-graduate courses with ECTS value. The courses will be focused on the following areas: cultural heritage, business, economy, tourism, intercultural issues, education, biology, the environment, security issues, etc.

All participants in the EMUNI Summer School will receive a certificate. In addition, for a positive assessment of individual courses, students will receive the Transcript of Records with the obtained ECTS credits.

### Participants:

- students (post-graduate and undergraduate)
- others interested in the courses

### Lecturers – Language

Each course will be delivered by two or three lecturers, one from Slovenia and the others from another Euro-Mediterranean higher education institution. Tuition will be in English.

Roundtables on a variety of topics will be held every week. The discussions will be in French, Arabic or other languages.

### Teaching Methods

Courses will be delivered on the basis of blended learning, a combination of on-line and face-to-face tuition. Study materials will be available in the e-classroom about a month before the course starting date.

### Social Program

Trips to different places of interest, such as Bled, Ljubljana, Pula and Venice, will be organized every week. Students will also be taken on a company tour and will have the opportunity to participate in a cultural evening.

### Attend the EMUNI Summer School:

- *meet renowned teachers from Slovenia and other Euro-Mediterranean higher education institutions;*
- *obtain internationally recognized ECTS credits;*
- *make new friends from the Mediterranean area and other parts of the world;*
- *gain international and intercultural experience;*
- *explore the Slovenian heritage.*

### Fees

- the registration fee is 100 EUR
- the tuition fee for each course is 300 EUR

### Accommodation

- Student Residence (at EMUNI Center): from 20 EUR per person per day in a double room

- private accommodation: from 80 EUR per day for 4 persons

### Grants

Students can ask for grants for the tuition fee and accommodation in the Student Residence.
